



Fundraising Idea that ROCK:

*(*as always, please refer to federal and your local rules and regulations on hosting fundraisers)*

Annual Events (happens every year as your major fundraiser):

- Golf Scramble – Players pay admission, sponsors get to have signs/displays, sometimes there is a raffle of donated items. Winner receives prizes that have been donated or purchased out of the potential profits.
- Craft Fair – Vendors pay for a booth and shoppers pay an admission fee
- Bazaar – Selling more than crafts (Wine, food, antiques, etc.)
- Antiques Fair – Antique vendors come and either pay a booth fee or a percentage of their sales. Usually charge an admission fee for shoppers.
- Book Fair – Work with a book vendor to hold a book fair in a local area.
- 5K or 10K Run – Most money is made via sponsorship, but some is made from entrance fees for the run
- Gift Basket Auction – Most items are donated from local businesses and then auctioned off. It allows for the Club to make the proceeds from the Auction and allows the business to advertise as people attend the event and hear about the items.

Special Events (every once and a while):

- Monte Carlo or Wild West Night – fundraiser that includes fake gambling with fake money – win prizes or cash out chips for raffle tickets opportunities.
- Deliver Candy Trees or Valentines for people during a deployment - (Soldiers/Airmen/Marines/Sailors) pay to have the club make up a gift basket and then it is delivered to the receiving spouse)
- Partner with local restaurants or other shops for dining/shopping events - (IE – All purchases get a 10% donation to your club)



Monthly Recurring Events (Something you do every month or ongoing that raises money):

- Flocking – People pay to have volunteers place a flock of plastic flamingos in the yard of someone with a sign that says happy birthday or welcome home, etc.
- Bake Sale or other Food donation event (Popcorn in a public area of base)
- Rental of decoration items that the Clubs owns and will rent out to community members.
